




Did you know?

Academic writing tips:

- Remember to structure your essays!
- Always include an introduction, main body and a conclusion as this will help your essay flow better.
- Keep an eye on the tense of the verbs you are using. Always make sure they are appropriate for the subject matter.
- Always proofread your work— either by yourself or ask friends or colleagues. This can help to detect mistakes which you may have not registered.
